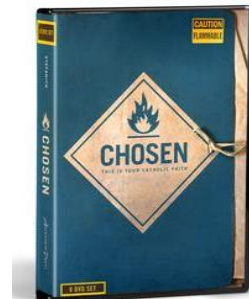
Chosen is a catechetical journey for teenagers preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation, or who wish to enter the Sacramental life of the Church.

(There are two versions, the content difference is minimal)

The materials are designed to provide the essential intellectual and spiritual catechesis necessary for the journey to discipleship.

The goal of catechesis is to bring about a *personal encounter with Jesus Christ*. It is teaching for conversion. The result of effective catechesis is not a room full of smart students, but a community full of disciples. Each session of *Chosen* has been carefully laid out with this aim in mind.

The name *Chosen*, is meant to convey the understanding that rather than us choosing God, God has chosen *us* (see CCC 1). The process invites participants to hear, then to respond with faith, to the voice of God who has called each individual to become his son or daughter; simply because “he first loved us” (1 John 4:19).



The Chosen Catechetical Approach

Chosen follows the same three-phase catechumenal model used to prepare adults through RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). These stages are intended to facilitate conversion in the time leading up to the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation.

The three phases are expressed in the organisation and structure of the catechetical presentation, which follows the classic Scripture passage in which Christ reveals his identity to Thomas and the other apostles. Jesus said to him, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, except by me” (John 14:6). In *Chosen*, we discover that Jesus is:

- 1. The Way** - *The Pre-catechumenate*, a time to remove obstacles to belief (pre-evangelisation sessions 1 and 2) and present the basic message of the gospel (evangelisation sessions 3 to 6). The goal of this phase is conversion of heart and to provide the “framework” or context for rest of the journey.
- 2. The Truth** - *The Catechumenate*, the time of formation (sessions 7 to 17). When the heart discovers who Jesus is and is trained to follow him, the seeds of faith, which may have been planted at Baptism and strengthened through Confirmation, will flourish in new life.
- 3. The Life** - *Purification and enlightenment* is a phase of more intense interior formation in final preparation for completion of the sacraments of initiation and for a life of discipleship. (Sessions 18 to 24).* [General Directory for Catechesis (GDC) 59]

Following the celebration of the sacraments of initiation the young people engage in a period of *mystagogy*. This is the phase in which the newly initiated Christian becomes fully immersed in the mysteries received and in the life of the Christian community.

Session Overview designed for a 90-minute session – *adapt to suit your own needs.*

1. Review of the previous session and opening prayer,
2. A video presentation,
3. Small-group discussion,
4. Group discussion and closing remarks, followed by a closing prayer, and
5. Homework, which reinforces the material learned that week.

Chosen Session Format 90 minutes

1. **Welcome and “Review Game”** (5 minutes, from Session 3)
A DVD-based review of the previous week’s material. Questions are drawn from the “Watch It!” section and the “Hero of the Week,” “Wrap-Up,” and “What’s That Word?” from the previous session. The game can be made competitive and adapted for use in a variety of ways.
2. **Challenge of the Week Review** (5 minutes)
Share experiences of the “challenge” they chose to take on the previous week in pairs or small groups and one or two with the wider group.
3. **Opening Prayer** (3 minutes)
The prayer is based on the topic for the week and / or the liturgical season.
4. **Dive In** (5 minutes)
A thought-provoking story to draw candidates into the topic for the week. Various methods can be used to present the story, which leads into the video.
5. **Watch It! - Small-Group Discussion** – Video Presentations and conversations (50 minutes)
The video lessons are divided into three segments of four to eight minutes each. * At the end of each segment, the video is paused, and candidates respond by answering the two or three questions in their notebooks. The candidates are invited to share in small groups before viewing the next segment.

Recommended questions are printed in the Leader’s Guide; these can be adapted or modified to meet the needs of your group. Many questions are “open ended” and therefore could have several possible responses, not just a simple answer key. Other questions have *Catechism* references or other printed responses to assist in facilitating the discussion.
6. **To the Heart** (10 minutes)
The group come back together to read the “To the Heart” story, either silently, aloud by the leader or a candidate. A thought-provoking question is included in the Leader’s Guide for discussion.

In the first session “To the Heart” feature is omitted to give time to make clear the expectations for the process.

7. To the Heart Hero of the Week (5 minutes)

Each lesson highlights a saint whose life and work embodies that week's topic. This piece can be read either silently or aloud by the leader or by a candidate.

8. Challenge of the Week (2 minutes)

Each week, candidates will be asked to choose from one of three personal challenges to help them apply that learning from the session. During the week, they complete the challenge, reflect and make a written response to share at the next session.

9. Take away ... and Notices (2 minutes)

Before the closing prayer, remind candidates to read the "Wrap-Up" and the "What's That Word?" vocabulary section in the "Take away", review the "Watch It!" questions and the "Memory Verse" ready for the next "Review Game." Remind participants of the "Challenge of the Week."

10. Closing Prayer (3 minutes)

A short prayer linked to the session topic and /or liturgical year. Invite the group to mention any prayer intentions they wish to include.

Chosen - Additional resources available

- **Student Workbook** The workbook includes text linked to session input, reflection questions with space to record answers, information on the *Hero of the Week*, and further reflection for homework. The workbooks are OK if the resource is being used with the 13-16 age group, but not necessary for an older group. A journal in which to make notes and record reflections is probably more suitable for older teenagers.
- **Discipleship Commitment** At the beginning of the journey young people are invited to sign their agreement to take a full and active part in *Chosen*, and uphold the values being promoted. The Commitment form can be downloaded free from the website.
- **Service of Penance** The resource includes a number of activities for use in preparing young people for the Sacrament of Penance. Detailed information on how to run the activities is included, along with suggestions for readings, prayers and songs.
- **Examination of Conscience** A separate resource to accompany the Service of Penance. This resource provides reflection questions related to the Ten Commandments and corporal works of mercy. It also states the requirements for the sacrament of penance.
- Three further resources
Class time outlines, Parent Session Outline, Pre-confirmation Retreat weekend are included for *Chosen - confirmation*, but not *Chosen - Your Faith*. Each could be adapted for use with any group of young people. *All are available from the website.*
